





5 TULSA'S NATIVE ROOTS



See the birthplace of Tulsa at Creek Nation Council Oak Park. The Muscogee people of Locv Pokv arrived in Indian Territory in 1836 during the Trail of Tears. In a ceremony proclaiming their arrival and establishing their new home, they placed the ashes from their original Alabama ceremonial fires at the base of a towering oak tree on a hill overlooking th Arkansas River. Here, they brought to life a new fire and began to rebuild and reestablis their tribal government. Known as Tulsa's first city hall, this site continues to be used for tribal gatherings by the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.


Noolaroc is open year-round and is a 3,700-acre wildlife preserve home to free roaming bison, elk, longhorn cattle, zebras, and more. The grounds feature the historic lodge home, welcome center and prairie dome café, hiking trails, and playground. The 50,000 sq. ft. one-of-a-kind museum eatures Native American art and artifacts, the Woolaroc airplane, world-class art by master artists such as Moran, Remington, Russell, and Leigh, an extensive Colt firearm collection, and much more. Animal Barn and Mountain Man Camp are open seasonally.

PAWNEE BILL RANCH AND MUSEUM


