



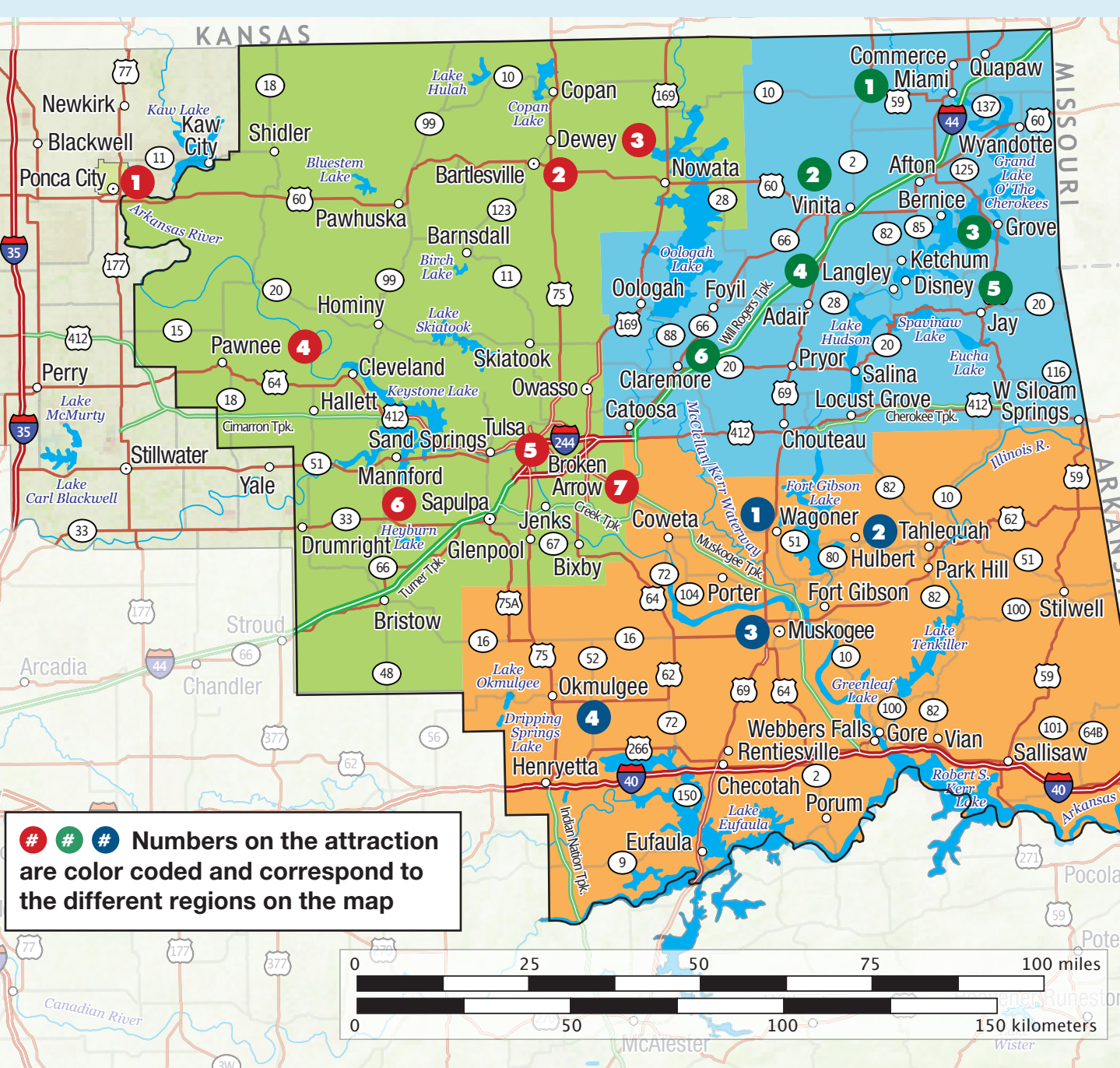

3 FIVE CIVILIZED TRIBES MUSEUM

Located on Agency Hill, the museum is housed in the historic 1875 Union Agency. Protecting the culture and heritage of the 5 Tribes (Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Muscogee and Seminole) through art and history. The museum features arts shows, cultural exhibits and tells the story of the Indian removal. Handmade gifts, jewelry, fine art and literature are available in the Trading Post gift shop.

1 THE WAGONER HISTORY CENTER

Wagoner, "The Queen City of the Prairie" was the first city incorporated in Indian Territory. The rich history of the founding settlers is documented in the Shirle Lamb Williams Exhibit (a descendent of the first Wagoner family). The collections include photos, documents, and furniture. The Center also hosts traveling exhibits. Currently on display is Jim Halsey's "Legends of Country Music" and includes Gold/Platinum albums, posters, stage wear, guitars, and Grammy Awards.

4 CREEK NATION COUNCIL HOUSE

The Creek Council House stands as a bridge from pre-removal Muscogee life in the North American southeast to a new life in Indian Territory. Discover the richly diverse culture and truly unique historic site of the Muscogee people restored to its original appearance in the town square of Okmulgee. Across the street, discover the uniqueness of The Redstick Gallery. All merchandise is made by enrolled Muscogee (Creek) citizens or enrolled members of another federally recognized tribe.

5 TULSA'S NATIVE ROOTS

See the birthplace of Tulsa at Creek Nation Council Oak Park. The Muscogee people of Lovv Pokv arrived in Indian Territory in 1836 during the Trail of Tears. In a ceremony proclaiming their arrival and establishing their new home, they placed the ashes from their original Alabama ceremonial fires at the base of a towering oak tree on a hill overlooking the Arkansas River. Here, they brought to life a new fire and began to rebuild and reestablish their tribal government. Known as Tulsa's first city hall, this site continues to be used for tribal gatherings by the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.

2 WOOLAROC MUSEUM AND WILDLIFE PRESERVE

Woolaroc is open year-round and is a 3,700-acre wildlife preserve home to free roaming bison, elk, longhorn cattle, zebras, and more. The grounds feature the historic lodge home, welcome center and prairie dome café, hiking trails, and playground. The 50,000 sq. ft. one-of-a-kind museum features Native American art and artifacts, the Woolaroc airplane, world-class art by master artists such as Moran, Remington, Russell, and Leigh, an extensive Colt firearm collection, and much more. Animal Barn and Mountain Man Camp are open seasonally.

4 PAWNEE BILL RANCH AND MUSEUM

Explore the myth, the legend and the reality of Pawnee Bill at his ranch and home in Pawnee, Oklahoma. See Pawnee Bill's mansion, artifacts, art, memorabilia, and live buffalo. Longhorn cattle & Clydesdale horses on one of Oklahoma's most beautiful historical working ranches. A historical re-creation and weekend celebration of Pawnee Bill's famous Wild West Show is held the second weekend of June every year. Ranch Hours: Wed-Sat 10am-5pm, Sun 1pm-4pm; Closed all state holidays.

1 MARLAND ESTATE

The E.W. Marland Estate, a 55 room Italian Renaissance Villa, is the manifestation of an oil baron's dream to live in a Palace. A National Historic Landmark, it is one of Oklahoma's most opulent and spectacular structures. Hear the saga of fortunes made and lost and of Governor Marland's beautiful, mysterious second wife, Lydie.
